CHITUKA VILLAGE PROJECT

The Banda Bola Sports Foundation-Chituka Village Project is located in Nkhata Bay South District, Northern Malawi, Central Africa.

Children in Malawi face many adversities, including poverty, famine, disease and short life expectancies. School attendance is not mandated by the government and, because of various hardships, many children do not attend school. Those who do attend school lack basic supplies like pens, pencils and notebooks. The student-teacher ratio is as high as 80-to-1, making individualized attention nearly impossible. As a result, many children do not have the opportunity to learn.

The children also face hardships at home that prevent them from attending school and deprive them of a sense of childhood. Many young girls find themselves taking on the role of a parent for their siblings or are pressured to marry at an early age.

The Chituka Village Project plans to affect change in these areas. We provide basic resources and offer after-school sports activities and educational tutoring.

The Foundation has partnered with local organizations, Mzuzu University, secondary schools and soccer clubs to secure volunteer mentors and coaches. The result will be bright futures and endless possibilities for those who participate.





OUR MISSION

- 1 To encourage children in Malawi to attend school by providing after school sports programs.
- 2 To raise funds and collect school supplies and sports equipment for children to attend school and participate in sports.
- To promote, encourage and educate children in Malawi in the principles of athletics, sportsmanship, and teamwork.

We are committed to improving the lives of youth in Malawi. Currently, we have over 23 local volunteers working as mentors, trainers and teachers for children throughout the Chituka Village area. We use sports as a catalyst for improving school attendance, encouraging gender equality, and motivating personal growth.






GENDER

Not only do we monitor gender ratios within our soccer teams, we also support female empowerment through a program that removes barriers related to menstruation by teaching young women how to sew their own pads.





HEALTH

Food insecurity negatively impacts health and education outcomes. It contributes to increased school absenteeism, dropout rates, poor learning capacity, and educational gender gaps.

In 2018, Chiktuka Village Project provided an in-school feeding program for

TIMELINE

2009

- BBSF sponsors first co-ed soccer tournament in Chituka Village. 4 primary schools participate
- School for the Deaf fields a girls team

2010

- BBSF begins equipment collections from colleges, youth sports organizations, elementary and high schools, libraries and churches
- UMass Soccerfest fundraiser in the US

2011

- BBSF partnership with Jack Brewer Foundation.
- GE donates refurbished computers
- 1st container of donated goods arrives in Chituka
- First Sports Day in Chituka Village

2012

- Scholastic Soccer League created in Bandawe
 Zone. 7 schools are eligible
- After School Reading/Mentoring Program begins

2013

- Scholastic Soccer League expands to 10 schools
- 2nd container of donated goods arrives in Chituka
- Dutch Volunteers run clinics in Chituka
- 12 local volunteers participate in BBSF programs

2014

- M.O.U and increased work with Mzuzu University
- Program receives attention and support from local Malawi Member of Parliament
- Scholastic Soccer League plays 8 games
- School passing rates among girls improve

2015

- 3rd container of donated goods arrives in Chituka
- Coaches Across Continents (CAC) partnership
- BBSF distributes balls to all 30 schools in region
- US Volunteers run clinics in Chituka
- BBSF establishes Summer Reading Program

- Mooncatcher partnership provides hygiene products to help keep girls in school
- After School Program begins registrations
- 15 local volunteers are participating

2016

- 1st women's showcase: Kachere and Tukombo Zones
- Partnership established with Kickin'Back
- Coaches Across Continents 2nd year of clinics
- BBSF adopts Child Protection Policy
- Promoted Mzuzu area Women's League
- M.O.U with Nkhata Bay Development Trust (NBDT)
- Scholastic Soccer league expands to all 30 schools in the 3 zone area 1500 girls and boys are participating

2017

- Historic first 3 students from Malenga Mzomba Primary School selected for National Secondary School
- Coaches Across Continents runs 2 weeks of clinics
- MYOBD 16 Volunteers give clinics to 30 primary schools
- CONGOMA registration (established as NGO in Malawi)
- After School Lunch Program Begins
- Laptop donation from Niskayuna Rotary


2018

- Developing proper field and latrines, support of MYOBD
- Fundraising and donation events by Kickin' Back, CDYSL, UMass women's soccer and BBSF in the US
- Kickin' Back sends container of women's sports apparel, equipment, and books. Distributed to over 35 schools
- 60+ volunteer coaches trained by CAC

2019

- Girls' changing rooms building foundation laid
- Co-ed league begins for grades 1-4 in Bandawe Zone
- 9 schools receive metal soccer goal posts
- Mooncatcher distributes sewing machines at Malenga Mzoma Primary School for menstrual pad production
- MYOBD funds School of the Deaf poultry farming program and runs soccer clinic for coaches
- Northern region girls soccer showcase held in Chituka region
